vourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed. (Rom. 2:5)

God "will give to each person according to what he has done.*" (Rom. 2:6).

The faith that justifies is a <u>"faith expressing itself through love"</u> (Gal 5:6). Paul's teaching here parallels James: <u>"Faith without works is dead"</u> (see Jas 2:14–26). Unless faith is living and produces a harvest of <u>"true righteousness and holiness"</u> (Eph 4:24), <u>it is not true faith</u> (see Phil 1:9–21).

HONOR AND SHAME	

- To those who by persistence in doing good <u>seek glory, honor and immortality,</u> he will give eternal life. (Ro. 2:7)
- But for those who are <u>self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil</u>, there will be wrath and anger. (Ro. 2:8)

There will <u>be trouble and distress for every human being who does evil</u>: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile; 10 but <u>glory, honor and peace for everyone who does good</u>: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. (Ro. 2:9-10)

For <u>God does not show favoritism.</u> (Ro. 2:11)

III. PRACTICE WHAT YOU - DON'T	Γ BE A
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Now you, if you call yourself a Jew; if you rely on the law and brag about your relationship to God; 18 if you know his will and approve of what is superior because you are instructed by the law; 19 if you are convinced that you are a guide for the blind, a light for those who are in the dark, 20 an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of infants, because you have in the law the embodiment of knowledge and truth— (Ro 2:17–20).

- you, then, who teach others, do you not teach yourself? (Ro 2:21).
- You who preach against stealing, do you steal? (Ro 2:21)
- You who say that people should **not commit adultery**, do you **commit adultery**?(Ro 2:22).

IV.	CHANGE IS THE KEY

A man is not a Jew if he is only one outwardly, nor is circumcision merely outward and physical. 29 No, a man is a Jew **if he is one inwardly**; and **circumcision is circumcision of the heart, by the Spirit,** not by the written code. Such a man's praise is not from men, but from God. (Ro 2:28–29).

God sees not as man sees, for man looks at the outward appearance, <u>but the Lord looks at the heart.</u> (1 Samuel 16:7)
