WINNING THE WAR ON SIN Romans: The Power of the Gospel Romans 6:1-23 Kevin T. Hardy July 10, 2022

What shall we say, then? *Shall we go on sinning* so that grace may increase? (Ro 6:1).

What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? (Ro 6:15).

By no means!

SO HOW DO WE WIN THE WAR ON SIN?

1). UNDERSTAND WHAT NEEDS TO BE ______

<u>We died to sin</u>; how can we <u>live in it any longer</u>? 3 Or <u>don't you know</u> that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were <u>baptized into his death</u>? (Ro 6:2–3)

We were therefore <u>buried with him through baptism into death</u> in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, <u>we too may live a new life.</u> (Ro 6:3–4).

We have been *emancipated from the bondage to SIN* by the *GRACE* of God through Jesus Christ.

YOU HAVE CHANGED YOUR _____!

For <u>we know that our old self was crucified with him</u> so that <u>the body of sin might be done away with</u>, that we should <u>no longer be slaves to sin</u>— 7 because anyone who has died has been freed from sin. (Ro 6:6–7).

2). _____ THE COST!

In the same way, count (consider) yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus. (Ro 6:11).

Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. 3 *For you died*, and *your life is now hidden with Christ in God*. 4 When Christ, *who is your life*, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Col. 3:2-4

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If any of you wants to be my follower, <u>you must give up your own way</u>, take up your cross, and follow me. (Matt. 16:24)

Therefore <u>do not let sin reign</u> in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. (Ro 6:12).

YOURSELF COMPLETELY TO THE REIGN OF CHRIST

Do not offer the parts of your body to sin, as **instruments of wickedness**, but rather **offer yourselves to God**, as those who have been brought from death to life; and **offer the parts of your body to him as instruments of righteousness.** 14 For sin shall not be your master, because you are not under law, but under grace.(Ro 6:13–14).

Don't you know that when <u>you offer yourselves to someone</u> to obey him as slaves, you are slaves to the one whom you obey—whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or <u>to obedience</u>, which leads to righteousness?(Ro 6:16).

But <u>thanks be to God</u> that, though <u>you used to be slaves to sin</u>, you wholeheartedly obeyed the form of teaching to which you were entrusted. 18 <u>You have been set free from sin</u> and have become <u>slaves to righteousness</u> (Ro 6:17–18).

I put this *in human terms* because you are weak in your natural selves. Just as <u>you used to offer the parts of your body</u> in slavery to impurity and to ever-increasing wickedness, so <u>now offer them in slavery to righteousness leading to</u> <u>holiness.</u> (Ro 6:19).

When you were slaves to sin, you were *free from the control of righteousness.* 21 *What <u>benefit did you reap</u> at that time from the things you are now ashamed of? <u>Those things result in death!</u> (Ro 6:20–21).*

But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves to God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. (Ro 6:22).
